AMA Pro Road Racing Returns to Barber Motorsports Park

Spring Date for 2011

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.– ZOOM Motorsports announced today the return of AMA Pro Road Racing to Barber Motorsports Park, June 17-19, 2011. The 2011 race will mark AMA Pro Road Racing's ninth visit to the spectacular Alabama road racing complex. The full slate of AMA Pro Road Racing activities will take place in the more traditional spring date for 2011 in contrast to last year when the event served as the season finale in September.

The AMA Pro Road Racing series first visited Barber Motorsports Park in September of 2003 and then moved to a spring date from 2004 through 2009. Last year, the Barber Motorsports Park played host to the final race of the year that saw each road racing class championship decided. Appropriately, the AMA Pro Road Racing banquet was held at the Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum, one of the finest collections of motorcycles and Lotus race cars in the world.

"While we enjoyed having the season-ending championship last Fall, we are equally as excited to be back in our more traditional Spring date this year. Past AMA Pro National Guard SuperBike winners at Barber Motorsports Park include Aaron Yates, Mat Mladin, Ben Spies and Blake Young. The 2010 AMA Pro Daytona SportBike Champion Martin Cardenas has won every DSB race ever held at Barber Motorsports Park, although a number of other DSB riders have posted wins in other classes at the 14 turn natural terrain road course including Josh Herrin, Jake Zemke and Jason DiSalvo. Other current AMA Pro competitors who have previous wins at Barber Motorsports Park are Josh Hayes, Roger Hayden and in three different classes, Tommy Hayden.

AMA Pro National Guard SuperBike, AMA Pro Daytona SportBike, AMA Pro SuperSport and AMA Pro Vance & Hines XR1200 series will compete at the June 17th through the 19th 2011 weekend. In SuperSport, this will be an East Division event.
